



Red Tractor Licensing Eligibility Criteria

Every step in each sector assurance chain must be a current member of the required third-party accreditation scheme/s

Abattoir	Beef/Lamb slaughtered and split down into carcasses/fores/quarters only	No Yes: if producing offal with a RT claim	Red Tractor Assurance for Meat and Poultry Processing (RTMPP) Scheme (with Certification scope for slaughter of beef/lamb) or QMS Processing Scheme



Abattoir with Cutting plant	Beef/lamb slaughtered then split/deboned/cut, packed and labelled (with or without the logo) for sale to processors, retailers and food service	Yes	Red Tractor Assurance for Meat and Poultry Processing Scheme (with Certification scope for slaughter and cutting of beef/ lamb; must have RTMPP for slaughter, but can have BRCGS Food Safety Standard or FSSC 22000 or IFS Food for cutting/packing instead of RTMPP Food Safety module) or QMS Processing Scheme
Cutting Plant only	Brings in beef/lamb carcass/primals to further prepare/cut/pack for sale to processors retailers/food service	Yes	Red Tractor Assurance for Meat and Poultry Processing Scheme or QMS Processing Scheme or BRCGS Food Safety Standard or FSSC 22000 or IFS Food
Catering Butchers	Brings in beef/lamb primals to further prepare/cut/pack for sale to food service	Yes	Red Tractor Assurance for Meat and Poultry Processing Scheme or BRCGS Food Safety Standard or FSSC 22000 or IFS Food
Further Processing	Producing goods with meat as the main ingredient, which is packed/labelled for sale to retailers and food service Excludes Cooking	Yes	Red Tractor Assurance for Meat and Poultry Processing Scheme or BRCGS Food Safety Standard or FSSC 22000 or IFS Food

<p>Food Service</p>	<p>Purchases and promotes RT beef/lamb product/s using the RT Logo or Claim on menus, websites, magazines etc.</p>	<p>Yes</p>	<p>N/A All Red Tractor products sourced and sold with a Red Tractor Claim have been supplied by a Red Tractor Licensed company. The RT Claim must be specific to the Red Tractor product being promoted and not misleading to the consumer in any way</p>
